Welcome to La Voce di GCICS



This is the third year of the Brunch featuring typical Italian local food, prepared by the chefs at Mattison's 41. Fortunately or unfortunately, depending on your point of view, this year we have out grown the venue. Until this year the private dining room at Mattison's has been able to accommodate all who wished to attend the Brunch. Alas, a few days prior to the event, we are at 120% of capacity, bravo!



SCHOLARSHIP REPORT

Once again arrangements have been made to have our updated Scholarship Application for 2014 listed by the Department of Pupil Support Services of the Sarasota County School District in its 2013-2014 Scholarship Opportunities publication for graduating students. The Department has also committed to distribute copies of the application to the Guidance Office of each district school in December. GCICS will also distribute, in early December, copies of the Application and Guide to the other schools in our catchment area that encompasses high schools south of the Manatee River and West of the Myakka River.

The application and the guide for its preparation are the same as those of the past scholarship year, except for relevant dates and the required essay topic which this year, asks the applicant to "assess the life and works of Constantino Brumidi and his contributions to American culture."

Brumidi, who has come to be known as the Michelangelo of the US Capitol, was commissioned by the fourth Architect of the Capitol to provide a design for "a picture 65 feet in diameter, painted in fresco, on the concave canopy over the eye of the new Dome of the US Capitol."

Brumidi was contracted to paint the fresco and completed the work in 11 months, at the end of the Civil War. He called the work the "Apotheosis of Washington", literally, the deification of Washington, or more commonly, the glorification of a person (President Washington), as an ideal. In the central group of the fresco, Washington is depicted as rising to the heavens, flanked by the figures of Liberty and Victory. Thirteen females, representing the original colonies, arch around the three central figures.

Brumidi painted scores of frescoes and murals throughout the Capitol from 1855 until his death in 1880.

MAIALETTO ARROSTITO (Roasted Piglet)

Our members know him as Vincent Amoroso, or simply Vince. On Saturday November 16, Vince will become the Rosticciere of a Maialetto on the Beach at 1224 North Casey Key Road in Osprey, the home of members AG and Shelia Spicola. We are having a pig roast! A most unique roast in that **100%** of all proceeds will go directly to the Scholarship Fund.

The Spicolas, **GCICS** board members, and other members are volunteering to sponsor the costs of the food, preparation, presentation, and parking station. North Casey Key Road is a special place in Sarasota. When traveling on North Casey Key Road resolve yourself to not be impatient. After you have traveled longer than you expect, keep going, understanding that southbound traffic has the right of way and you may have to duck into a driveway to clear the way.

On arrival at 1224, expect a valet to take your car keys and hide your car, as there are few parking spaces. You will be greeted by who ever is around. You may head to the beach for shelling, bird

watching, wading, sunning or, whatever, but don't touch the turtle nests. Or you may organize or join a bocce game at the Spicolas' Bocce court, find a place to have a glass with friends or, more likely, watch the Rosticciere do his thing with the Maialetto.

It all starts at 3:30, with the serious food at around 5:00, and a rising full moon at 7 or so. In between, so far, wine, beer, sodas, Cheese and Crackers, followed by Antipasti, Caponata, Olive Salad and Bread. With the Maialetto, German potato salad, cannellini beans with tomatoes and spinach, rapini, green beans, roasted red peppers and onion salad, as well as mixed greens salad.

The wrap-up is dessert; we're looking for a volunteer sponsor here.

This is a wonderful opportunity for a family. Children and grandchildren under 11 are free; those between 12 and 16, \$ 20 each. Adults, \$40 per person.
